LONDON AND NORTH WESTERN RAILWAY OVERPRINTS

The London and North Western Railway postcards may often be found with overprints on the back of the card. In some cases this was private advertising, coal merchants, boots and shoes, bicycles and so on; possibly the cards were supplied at low cost by the LNWR, who would also benefit from the exposure. No attempt has been made to record these non-railway overprints.

The LNWR themselves frequently overprinted cards, from 1904 right through to the grouping in 1923, often using stocks of cards superseded by new issues. The overprints, some just in the correspondence space, others covering the entire back of the card, were used to advertise various services ranging from excursions to supply of the actual postcards. Cards were also overprinted for correspondence use, with some 90 variations currently recorded. Add to these more than 260 advertising overprints, and it can be seen that this is a field well worthy of investigation.

This list is an attempt to record these overprints, which have been grouped in categories to try to make identification easier. Each overprint has been allocated a reference code, comprising the letter for the category together with a two digit number. This is the same format as used for the 'original' back prints on the McCorquodale cards recorded in Checklist 2; the code letters used there are not used in this list. In a few cases it will be seen that an overprint listed here is the same as one of the original prints recorded in Checklist 2. A new reference is allocated to differentiate between overprints and original prints.

To refer to a particular card and overprint just add the overprint code to the card reference number. Full details of the cards may be found in *Railway Postcard Checklist Number 2*.

There are no doubt more overprints to be recorded, and details/photocopies of any not listed would be appreciated.

'Desc gap' refers to the space that may be left below the LNWR heading to accommodate the description already printed on the card. This was not always done, but conversely may be found even where the card does not carry a description. Close examination will show other minor variations of shading on many of the correspondence cards; no attempt is made to record these. There is considerable variation in the colour described as brown, but the few overprints shown as red are clearly that colour.

The right hand column in the checklist gives the colour of the overprint and the amount of the card covered:

- 1 Full overprint covering correspondence and address space;
- ½ Correspondence space only;
- ¼ Top of correspondence space only.
- » Triangle in top left corner.
